- ▶ **Safe and secure:** The state of Vermont and the city of Burlington consistently receive high rankings for safety.



Unique residential experience

Nestled into Burlington's historic Hill Section overlooking Lake Champlain and the Adirondack Mountains, Champlain's campus offers the ideal home away from home. The 18 residence halls include magnificent Victorian-era mansions, once the homes of Burlington's leading citizens, now renovated and wired to include every modern convenience—creating a residential experience unlike any other college. All dorms are only a short walk from the center of campus and downtown Burlington.

Home away from home

As you might imagine, each of our residence halls is unique with one-of-a-kind rooms and striking architectural features. Adorned with period woodwork, charming bay windows and fireplaces, no two dorms at Champlain are alike. Getting to know your dorm-mates is easy, because our largest residence hall has only 55 students and the smallest has just 15. Geographical diversity also contributes to each dorm's uniqueness. Last year, students from 28 countries and 26 states attended Champlain.



All dorms are coed with single-sex floors, and most house a mix of students from freshmen through seniors.

Although not required, approximately 90 percent of our first-year students choose to live on campus. Each residence hall has a live-in Resident Assistant and adult Head Resident to help students navigate campus, get to know Burlington and plan activities.

- a microwave oven and coin-operated laundry facilities in each dorm.

The perfect college town


